Please note that this update is divided into two sections. The first section, Overall Updates, contains important information pertaining to all residents, while the second section, Phase Updates, contains specific information pertaining to particular residents.

## **OVERALL WEEKLY UPDATES**

### **Safety**

With school beginning in a few weeks, please remind your children to stay clear of all construction operations, machines, and stockpiled materials as they travel to and from their school bus stops. School bus operators for Edina Public Schools are aware of the reconstruction schedule. The operators may adjust their school bus routes to avoid reconstruction activities. Job site safety is our number one concern.

### **Who to Contact in an Emergency:**

During a life or property-threatening emergency, call 911. If construction equipment or materials need to be moved as part of dealing with the emergency, 911 has a list of emergency contacts for the Contractor.

## **PHASE UPDATES**

### **Phase 1**

#### **Sod and Restoration**

During the week of August 31, the contractor should begin the placement of the new sod. With the large rain events over the last couple of weeks, the contractor is having trouble getting the sod out of the fields.

## Phase 2

### Streets and Driveways

During the week of August 31, the contractor will begin patching the blacktop area that was removed to install the concrete driveway apron at the blacktop driveways.

### Sod and Restoration

During the week of August 31, the contractor will begin backfilling the area behind the concrete curb and gutter in anticipation of the placement of new sod. This work should take 2-3 days.

## Phase 3

### Streets and Driveways

Beginning the week of August 31, on Ashcroft and 59<sup>th</sup>, the contractor will move gravel from one side of the street and stockpile it on the opposite side. This is to expose the street's foundation soils and to make any corrections needed. Once the first side of the street has been completed, the contractor will move all the gravel to the other side and repeat their work. Additional gravel may be needed to allow for the installation of curb and gutter. This will take approximately 3 days to complete per street.

If you live along these streets, you will have overnight access to your driveways. During the day, there will be no parking along these streets and there will be periods of time when you cannot access your driveway. If you need to run errands, it would be a good idea to remove your car by 7 a.m. and park on any of the surrounding streets.

During either the week of August 31 or September 8, the contractor will install concrete curb and gutter and concrete driveway aprons (weather permitting) along St. John's and 60th. After the concrete is poured it will take 3 - 4 days to gain enough strength before you can drive vehicles on it. During this period, you will not be able to use your driveway. We ask you to please move your vehicle(s) out of your driveway before the work begin, otherwise, they will be trapped in your driveway. The contractor will notify you of the actual date and time using a doorknob hanger. From now on, please check your front door each day for such notices.

During the 3 - 4 days it takes for the concrete to harden, you can park overnight **along the east side only** of St. John's. You are not allowed to park on both sides because there would be insufficient room for emergency vehicles to quickly access homes along these streets.

The contractor will set out temporary no parking signs to remind you of this temporary parking ban along the west side of St. John's. There is likely insufficient space for all of you to park; therefore, parking is also available along Phase 1 & 2 streets.

We understand that this is an inconvenience for you. If you have special needs such as, but not limited to, medical supply deliveries or handicapped access issues please now call me. The contractor will work with you to accommodate your special need.

The signal that you can resume using your driveway will be when the contractor builds a gravel ramp to your driveway apron.
